WHITE PINE LIBRARY COOPERATIVE ADVISORY COUNCIL MEETING

Minutes, March 14, 2007

Welcome: Rose Rice Gutierrez welcomed members.

Minutes: Stephanie Olson moved to approve the minutes from the January 10, 2007 meeting. Mimi Herrington seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Director's Report: Bryon Sitler reported that:

There will be no Bats for Libraries program this year due to the requirement to sell at least 1,000 tickets.

Open Houses for legislators were held throughout the cooperative service area. Turn out was good.

Capital Library Cooperative is closing. Libraries from Gratiot and Clinton counties have expressed interest in joining White Pine. They must first withdraw from Capital before they can apply to White Pine for membership.

The Gates Grant has been completed. Bryon is working on the final report.

The Cooperative Directors' Association appointed a committee to explore the future of Cooperatives. Bryon has been appointed chair. The committee will look at what Cooperatives should like be in the future and what services should be offered.

Performers: Karen Puszykowski reported:

Nine libraries booked performers through the cooperative.

Most libraries booked 3-4 performers.

Most of the performers booked were from the Performers Showcase in Vassar held in January.

A few more were booked from the list.

All contracts have been signed.

Libraries will be sent their check to pay the performers a couple of weeks before the performance. The cooperative will then bill the library.

Advisory Council Meeting in Lansing: Members discussed the possibility of holding the May or June Advisory Council meeting at the Library of Michigan. It was decided that June 6, 2007 would be the best date. Bryon will make arrangements with the Library of Michigan.

Potential New Members: Bryon reported that:

5 libraries from Gratiot County and 5 libraries from Clinton counties have expressed interest in joining White Pine.

Libraries need to officially withdraw from Capital before applying to White Pine.

The new libraries would increase White Pine's income from \$363,380.00 to \$454,340.00.

All of the potential new members are automated and are in the process of joining MelCat.

Adding the 10 libraries would not damage White Pine's density payment.

Barb Butch moved to accept the libraries from Gratiot and Clinton Counties if they wished to join. Jim Rancilio seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Kate VanAuken recommended that Bryon write a letter welcoming them to join White Pine.

Budget Cuts: Bryon reported that the state's budget for this year and next year could result in big cuts for libraries and cooperatives.

Delivery and budget figures for this year and next were reviewed.
