## Board report December 2007

Congratulations to Rawson Memorial Library and staff for the State Librarian's Award of Excellence. The runners up were Peter White Public Library in Marquette and Bayliss Public Library in Sault Ste. Marie.

State Aid is set at: \$.329344 & for density: \$6.5487. We do not know when checks will be mailed. We will need to do a budget revision. This can be done after the new services listed below are discussed at the Ad Council meeting. Our first check has arrived.

Gates Grant information: WPCL will be the purchasing agent for 13 libraries, number includes branches. WPLC will receive \$19. Per computer ordered through the cooperative. If you are getting computers, you should have received the letter by now indicating how many. The contract with Library of Michigan arrived and is waiting the Board Chair's signature.

White Pine would like to offer bookkeeping services to members that would like to participate. District libraries especially may want to take advantage of the program.

Canceled Children's literature workshop due to low registration. We may try again in the spring.

The cooperatives are working on a joint workshop for all libraries in the State, as we did with the preservation workshops this spring. The topic is yet to be determined.

Performers' calendar will be shared with all the cooperatives in Michigan. Everyone is able to view the calendar to see which performers may be close to them. Only cooperative headquarters staff will be able to make changes.

Audit started November 6, 2007. The auditors were here one day. They will make their report at the January meeting.

Chippewa River District Library has agreed to do cataloguing for White Pine members. The fee is: \$7.50 for cataloguing and \$2.50 for processing (if desired).

Attended MLA Annual Conference 11/6-9/2007. It was a good conference. I was able to pick up some information that will help libraries as well as the cooperative.

It would be available for any municipality to participate. We need to look into the governance requirements and the practical methods of accomplishing this goal.

WPLC is thinking of offering new services: bookkeeping for member libraries; purchasing e-books coordination; a publicity/marketing campaign and collection evaluation. These services will be discussed at the Ad Council meeting.

FCC announces a \$400 million project to connect rural health care facilities with at least T1 capability, many with T2.

## SLS CORE REFERENCE LIST FOR PUBLIC LIBRARIES 6th Edition 2003

These are the items that every public library is required to have, according to the <u>SLS Minimum Reference Standards</u> for <u>Public Libraries</u> [Section III.A.1]. They serve as the foundation of a library's reference collection. This required list has only a few specific titles. The rest are subject areas for which the library must have at least one title to fulfill the requirement. Each bulleted item on the list requires at least one reference resource.

Libraries may use the <u>Recommended Reference Resources</u> for suggestions of titles in a subject area, or may choose any other title that fulfills the subject requirement. The numbering of the categories on this list matches that of the Recommended Reference Resources list to facilitate the selection of items to fill a requirement.

It is expected that the library will obtain the most recent edition where timeliness or currency is important. The physical format of these items is left to the choice of the individual library.
