Plan of Service committee met to finalize the revised Plan. It is on the agenda today.

The QSAC for Cooperatives three-year Plan was approved by the CDA at the meeting Friday (2/20/09). While working on the White Pine plan, we have conformed to the State plan template and incorporated some of the objectives into our plan.

Night of Notables at LM is 4/18. Christopher Paul Curtis is the main speaker. Author tours have been arranged – 50 speaking engagements.

Award of Excellence – has lost its sponsor. LM wants to continue celebrating libraries, so will continue the award without the monetary award.

White Pine has been using Ready talk for the committee meetings. It works very well and certainly saves a lot of driving and staff time, not to mention fuel.

LM has been slated to go into the Department of Education. This is not a done deal. Once the Executive Order is issued, the Legislature will make recommendations. It is an Executive Branch decision. This is step one. Next year, the goal is to reduce 18 departments into 8. So, LM (and State Aid) may move again.
